Course Overview

A qualification in English Language is essential for progressing into further training, education, or employment. This course is designed to help you achieve your goals by developing a wide range of skills in both written and spoken English.

You will build confidence in reading, writing, speaking, and listening-equipping you with the communication skills needed for everyday life and the workplace.

Course Requirements

This course is open to all adults.

- If you have a GCSE English grade 3 or a Level 2 Functional Skills English qualification achieved within the last five years, you will be invited to an interview to assess your suitability. You will not need to complete an initial assessment.

- If you have older qualifications or no formal English qualifications, you will be asked to complete a short written assessment to determine your current literacy level.

Please note: In most cases, we are unable to offer a resit if you already hold a GCSE English grade 4 or above.

What You Will Learn

A GCSE English course covers a range of skills related to the English language, literature, and communication. The course is designed to provide students with a strong foundation in reading, writing, speaking, and listening.

Reading Skills:

Literary Analysis: Analysing and interpreting texts, including novels, poetry, and plays.

Understanding Non-Fiction: Comprehending and critically evaluating non-fiction texts, such as articles, reports, and essays.

Writing Skills:

Creative Writing: Producing imaginative and original pieces, such as stories, poems, or scripts.

Analytical Writing: Crafting essays and responses that demonstrate an understanding of literary themes, characters, and techniques.

Transactional Writing: Developing skills in writing for different purposes, such as letters, articles, and speeches.

Speaking and Listening:

Presentations: Planning and delivering presentations on various topics.

Discussion and Debate: Participating in group discussions, debates, and spoken interactions.

Grammar and Vocabulary:

Assessment

- You will complete two written exams in June.
- You will also take part in one Spoken Language assessment, which is carried out internally during the year.

Completing a GCSE English course provides a strong foundation in language, communication, and literature.
