## What You Will Learn

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You will have the opportunity to receive specialist professional training in dancing, singing and acting. Training under current industry performers who's credits include reknowned names and shows such as Justin Timberlake, Madonna, Dirty Dancing, Coronation Street, Hollyoaks, Cats, Les Miserables, Charlie & The Chocolate Factory and Matilda, to name just a few with students receiving knowledge and teaching from the industry first hand. ## Assessment

## Progression

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You will complete the National Foundation Diploma course in your first year, and you can then progress on to our Extended Diploma qualification in your second year, in the same subject. This will help you to attain the optional units required to attain the full 3 A level equivalent qualification in your chosen subject. The course is intended as a preparation for Employment in the Arts Industry or as a step towards Higher Education.
